 - I hope to work with you and my Government is genuinely interested I bringing services there.

The response from the President Philip Miriori.

- 1. Thank you for your visit to Panguna.
 - You were the first to visit us after the crisis
- 2. Work being done in Panguna
 - Formation of North Solomons Cooperative Society for coffee
 - Francis Ona Foundation
 - Operation Clean Up
- 3. We need your help
 - Repeal of BCA
 - Ownership rights of land to be given back.
- 4. Reconciliation needed now between Meekamui and PNG
 - Your soldiers died together with our people

All team members were given 2-3 minutes each.

- Gregory Kopaa's coming was a reciprocal of PM's visit to Panguna on behalf of the people who fell during the war
- 2. Our coming direct to you was that the ABG was not listening to us.
- 3. ABG has no consultation with Meekamui.

4. We want to negotiate with any investor as landowners not second class citizens.

PM's Remarks

- 1. Sorry other ministers are not here.
- 2. I only heard your coming just yesterday.
- 3. We will work on the issues in the next meeting
- 4. I had a feeling of satisfaction after I came back from Panguna.
- 5. It is not my priority whether the mine is open or not. I want to work and see services provided.
- 6. I have no problem with giving back your land.
- 7. Develop proper plans to work with Investors.
- 8. See how the Government gave back Ok Tedi back to the landowners.
- 9. My Government has moral obligations to the people of PNG
- 10. We have given the Western Province 20% ownership of Ok Tedi on Free Carry economic arrangements.
- 11. December I will come to open the Aropa Airport.
- ₩12. John Momis is going ahead of me with important issues PNG can't allow that..
- 13. PNG is fragile with a lot of political developments
 - Autonomy and Independence that we don't set a precendent.
 - We must discuss issues together.
 - 14. This is the first time a genuine government has been in place in PNG.
- #15. ABG has not been organized to manage the funds-K200 million iS yet to show development for.
- ★16. Ok Tedi is your model to help you with mining in the future.
 - 2015-17 Western Province will become the rich Province in PNG
